- copies of *Walking Trail Handbook* were provided to all attendees at the Friends of Parks Forum in Port Lincoln and mailed to all Local Government CEO's.
- we were pleased to address meetings of the Friends of Onkaparinga National Park and the Friends of the Simpson Desert regarding the principles of managing walking trails.

Grants - make our world go round!

- We were successful this year with a Federal grant for an industrial mower, of course it turned up after the advent of the fire season so we will plan to use it next year!
- Responding to a local request we applied for grant to improve the marking of the track to Malloga Falls, we understand that this may now be held over until the current trail reviews are completed. The review has significant implications for how and where we might apply our future efforts
- That grant applications to State and Federal agencies are more welcome from incorporated bodies prompted our consideration of moving in that direction. After consideration and discussion with the DEH Volunteer Support Unit we have opted to maintain the *status quo*, at least for the time being. That walking needs an effective organisation independent of government is becoming more apparent as the years pass.

Activities in 2007

• Vulkathunha-Gammon Ranges

Oppaminda Nudlamutana, checked out a better and more interesting option for the section between Mt Warren Hastings to Nudlamutana Hut Weetootla, asset check

Italowie, asset check and remarked Checkpoint 6 to Italowie Gap trailhead New robust donation bollards installed at Italowie Gap, Grindell Hut, Weetootla Camp, Balcanoona and Munyallina

• Flinders Ranges National Park

Wilkawillina, asset check

Hayward Huts, asset check and with district support we were able to complete the installation of checkpoint maps. Serviced interception drains between Checkpoints H1 and H2

Bunyeroo Wilcolo, asset check, cleared track obstacles between Checkpoints B7 and B8

• Southern Flinders

Dutchman Stern, asset check, developed track between Checkpoint 4 and 2, serviced interception drains and cleared stone 2.6 - 3.0

Mount Brown, asset check, cleared fallen trees and replaced temporary markers between Checkpoints 2 and 3, applied distance decals to Waukarie Creek

Barossa

When not otherwise occupied we have endeavoured to put in a day a week especially on those walks in Parks, servicing interception drains and clearing fallen timber.

Burnside Walking Trails

We have supported an initiative by City of Burnside to develop a link track to from lower Hayward Drive up to the Mount Osmond Fire Track. When complete it will facilitate access to another interesting six kilometre circuit.
